The IEO has planned its 2012 show season. We are having 5 schooling shows offering dressage classes from USDF Introductory – USEF Grand prix, Prix Caprilli, Musical Freestyles, the USEA Combined training tests, and a Pony TOC class. **Prize money is also being offered!!!**

Our shows are stress-free and friendly. We offer great judges, helpful volunteers and wonderful footing in a calm, horse and rider friendly atmosphere. If you are new to dressage or just horse shows in general, come on out, and allow our volunteers to guide you through the process.

All of our shows will be held at Harmony Hill Farm in York Springs, PA, just south of Dillsburg.

The IEO offers great prizes for those competing in our shows. There is a High Score medal for each level and a High Score of the Day trophy given at each of our shows. All horse and rider combinations are eligible for the above awards even if you are not an IEO member. Series-End awards, given at the September show, are for IEO members and non-members alike. Only IEO members are eligible for Year-end awards, which are given at the annual banquet. See the awards page for more qualification information. New this year, the IEO is offering the chance to win prize money!!! This is something rarely offered at Dressage shows. This should be an exciting addition to our shows.

Please remember that we are an all-volunteer organization. In order for members to qualify for Year-End awards, you must volunteer at least 1 full day or 2 half days.

The IEO has an active Young Rider's Club in which all youth are free to participate.

In addition, joining the IEO allows one to meet other dressage enthusiasts in the area – of all ages – and to advance the practice and love of dressage in central Pennsylvania.

MEMBER AWARDS

- **Year-End Awards**—to the horse/rider combination with the highest average score for each level. Adult and Young Riders are scored separately, except in the USEA division.
 - The IEO Year-End Awards Program was created to reward our members for supporting our schooling show series. The awards are given to horse/rider combinations and are given for each USDF/USEF level. Awards will be presented at the annual IEO Banquet.
Divisions:
 - USDF Introductory (Jr. and Adult)
 - USEF Training Level, 1st Level, and 2nd Level (Jr. and Adult)
 - USEF 3rd Level and above combined (Jr. and Adult)
 - USEA Combined training test (all levels and age groups together)
 - To qualify:
 - The *rider* must be a member of the IEO when scores are earned.
 - The rider must contribute 1 full day or 2 half days of service to the IEO (shows, clinics, special programs).
 - The horse/rider combination must compete in at least 3 IEO schooling shows at the level at which they wish to be considered for a year-end award.
 - All scores will be averaged for this award.

Young Riders—all riders who have not reached their 22nd birthday as of December 31, 2012.

- **Rider Achievement Awards**—Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medals
 - A rider may achieve any or all of these awards on any horse *over any period of time*. Scores from both schooling shows sponsored by USDF Group Member Organizations, USDF-recognized shows, and USPC Dressage Rallies may be used.
 - **Bronze Medal** – 2 scores of 63% or better by 2 judges in 2 different tests in Training and First Levels (total of 4 scores).
 - **Silver Medal** – 2 scores of 60% or better by 2 judges in 2 different tests in Second and Third Levels (total of 4 scores).

- **Gold Medal** – 2 scores of 58% or better by 2 judges in 2 different tests in Fourth Level and any FEI level (total of 4 scores).

- **Leslie D. London Excellence Trophy**—perpetual trophy to be awarded to a horse/rider combination with the highest average score from our schooling shows, at First Level and above. The minimum average is 63%. The rider must be an IEO member at the time scores are earned.

Awards for members and non-members

These awards are available to IEO members *and* non-members

- **Show Awards – Awards offered at each show**
 - At each show we award High Score medal for each level
 - Highest score at each level (includes all test levels)
 - High Score MFS trophy.
 - High Score of the Day trophy awarded to the highest score of the day, which includes all tests except USEA and MFS tests.
 - **PRIZE MONEY** (see next page for more details)



- **Series Awards** – At the September show, Awards will be given for the highest average scores from 3 of the 5 shows. You **do not** have to be an IEO member for this award.
 - The horse/rider combination must show at 3 of the 5 IEO shows
 - The divisions are: Introductory, Training Level, First Level, Second Level and above, Pony TOC, USEA TOC, and Freestyle.
 - Places 1 – 6 in each division will be awarded
 - The top 3 scores must each be from a different judge, and will be averaged for placement.



Prize Money

New for 2012

IEO will offer the chance to win prize money!

In order to make our shows more exciting, we have decided to create a way for the participants at our shows to win prize money. Wouldn't it be nice to win money to take home!

If a rider wants to participate for prize money, all they will need to do is pay an additional \$10 per class. For example: If your class fee is \$20 then you would add \$10 to that, making your class fee \$30. The extra \$10 will be put into the pot, which will be paid back to the winners.

- There must be at least 3 participants in order to pay back.
- For every 3 participants, we will pay a placing.
 - Example:
 - 3 – 5 riders pays 1st place only
 - 6 – 8 riders pays 1st and 2nd
 - 9 – 11 riders pays 1 – 3
 - 12 – 14 riders pays 1 – 4
 - 15 – 17 riders pays 1 – 5
 - 18 and more will pay 1 - 6
- There will be 2 payback divisions:
 - Introductory level
 - USEF Training level – 3rd level

** For now, only USDF and USEF tests are eligible for prize money. As the stakes (payback) classes gain in popularity, divisions may be added, further splitting the levels.

You do not have to ride additional tests to participate for prize money. You will ride and place with your regular class, but those participating for prize money will be placed separately as well.

Directions to IEO Shows

Directions to Harmony Hill Farm: 141 Bateman Rd., York Springs, PA.

From Dillsburg: Take US 15 South approx. 6.2 miles from Rt 74. Take left on Latimore Valley Rd. Go 1.5 miles to right onto Ridge Rd. Go .7 miles to left onto Bateman Rd. Go .4 miles to farm.

From Gettysburg (US 30): take US 15 North 12.8 miles from Rt 30 to right onto Ridge Rd. Go 1.3 miles to right* onto Bateman Rd. Go .3 miles to farm on left.

(***NOTE:** If you have a larger rig, the right turn onto Bateman Rd may be difficult. Instead, continue past Bateman Rd on Ridge Rd. to Latimore Valley Rd. (2 miles from Rt 15) and turn right. After stone bridge, take slight right onto Quaker Church Rd. Go .7 miles to Bateman Rd, turn right, farm is .3 miles on the right)

From Wellsville (Rt. 74): From 74 in Wellsville, take York St. and go 1.1 miles until it turns into Wellsville Rd. Go another 1.9 miles to slight right over bridge on Kralltown Rd. Take immediate left after bridge onto Doe Run Rd. Go to stop sign and turn left onto Creek Rd. At end, turn right onto Baltimore Pike (Rt 194). Go .9 miles to left onto Pondtown Rd. Go 2.4 miles until Pondtown turns into Latimore Valley Rd. Go .3 miles to slight right just after stone bridge to Quaker Church Rd. Go .7 miles to Bateman Rd. Turn right. Farm is .3 miles on right.

IEO Schooling Show Rules

1. Classes 1-2 will be held as "flat classes," with all horse and rider combinations in the ring together.
2. Any Class will be combined or split at the organizers discretion.
3. All tests to be ridden in large dressage arena, except for USEA and Introductory level tests. They will be in 20m X 40m.
4. ALL COMPETITORS, GROOMS, ETC MUST WEAR current ASTM/SEI approved safety HELMETS or hard hats at all times WHILE MOUNTED.
5. 2011 USEF Tests, and 2010 USEA Tests will be used.
6. Based on USEF rule GR302 **Cruelty to and Abuse of a Horse:** Any action(s) against a horse by a competitor or an exhibitor, which are deemed excessive by a judge, or show management, in the competition ring or anywhere on the competition grounds may be punished by official warning, elimination, or other sanctions which may be deemed appropriate by the show committee.
7. All entries must be accompanied by check or money order, made **payable to "IEO"** in the proper amount. Also, entries must include proof of negative Coggins, dated within one year of the show date. If check and Coggins are not included, entry will be put on the waiting list if the show is full.
8. **Entries must be postmarked by the closing date.** The closing date for each show is posted with show information, usually 2 weeks before the show date. Entries are to be accepted on a "first come, first served" basis only if complete. To be considered complete, entries must include copy of current coggins and correct fees. (Coggins will no longer be held on file. **Send a copy with each entry.**) Entries received after the closing date, post marked after the closing date or received after the show schedule is posted will be put on a waiting list. **A LATE FEE OF \$5.00 PER CLASS WILL BE CHARGED FOR ENTRIES POSTMARKED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE.** If the late fee is not included with the entry then it must be paid before receiving packet if entry is accepted. No entries taken over the phone, fax or e-mail. In the event of over subscription, Members of the IEO will have priority provided their entry was received before the closing date. **A \$5 fee per ride will be assessed to anyone requesting changes after the closing date.** Special requests for ride times will be honored only at the Secretary's discretion. Please limit your requests, as this is a difficult process.
10. **Times** will be posted on the website, if at all possible, by Wednesday before show at www.ieodressage.org. Call secretary before Friday night if times are not posted. If you don't have access to the website, you may call the secretary for your times. As a common courtesy, please limit your calls to

the secretary for your times from **6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Wed. thru Friday, the week of the show.**

11. Horses may only be shown at 2 consecutive levels at any one show (i.e. Intro/Training, Training/First, First/Second). Even if the horse has 2 different riders this rule still applies (i.e. Rider A does training level and Rider B can only do Intro or First)
12. Braiding is optional and regular show attire is requested. If you do not wish to wear show attire, please wear conservative clinic attire, i.e. shirts of conservative color, with no neckwear, breeches or jodhpurs of conservative color, and appropriate riding boots.
13. USEF legal length (120 cm) whips may be carried.
14. Tests may be read aloud. Provide your own reader, please.
15. Tests will not be given out until the classes are pinned. Please do not ask at the secretary's stand until then.
16. **Refund policy:** No refunds after closing date unless your ride times are filled from a waiting list. If for Veterinary reason a horse is unsound or sick and unable to compete, a vet's note is required for a refund. Note must be received within 5 days of the show's conclusion if not before.
17. Shows will be run as closely as possible to USEF rules. It is the judge's, and or show management's discretion to eliminate riders based on illegal use of equipment. (bits, whips, spurs, etc.) Kimberwick bits are allowed for USDF Introductory and USEA Beginner Novice level riders only. All other riders must use USEF legal bits for dressage.
18. Dogs must be on a leash or confined at all times while on the show grounds, under penalty of elimination. Check show venues to see if they allow dogs
20. Children must be under adult supervision at all times.
21. If you are riding a Musical Freestyle, provide music early, to have tested in the PA system.
22. All trash and manure is to be removed from show grounds. Consistent offenders will be fined and/or banned from IEO shows.

Note*****Fee paid schooling in the actual competition arena will no longer be permitted due to time restraints and for the purpose of upgrading the quality of our schooling shows. If time allows, arena may be open before show starts for competitors to lead horses around outside of the show ring.

Note*****Lungeing is allowed in designated areas only. Offenders will be eliminated from the show. If not posted, please ask at the secretary's desk.

Failure to follow written rules or dangerous/inappropriate behavior will result in elimination and possibly being banned from further shows.

4. H/C (*hors de concours*) (*These are tests that are ridden in front of the judge, but not up for placement.*) Those entering H/C will discount the regular entry fee by \$2.00. The judge will score the horse/rider combination as usual, but the scores will not be totaled and the pair will not be eligible for a ribbon or be considered for placement in the class. If you ride 2X in a class, then the 2nd ride must be the HC ride.
5. A \$25.00 fee will be assessed on all returned checks, and no further checks will be accepted until the matter is cleared up.
6. \$5.00 will be charged for each change made after entries close, and for each class if entries are mailed after the closing date.

Each team should consist of **two or three riders** who will compete **at the same USDF or UDEF level, such as 2 or 3 riders competing at Training Level Test 2**. We offer Team classes at each level. All Team riders will ride **Test 2** of the level they are competing at. The scores of each team will be averaged and the team with the highest average score would win at that level.

The fee to enter a team in the competition is \$25.00 per team member. For Instance, if you are a 2-member team, the total fee is \$50.00 for the whole team, or \$75.00 if there are 3 riders on the team.

The competition takes place at our August show and runs in conjunction with the regularly scheduled show. **Please note that a special entry form for Teams is included in the Omnibus.**
